-new DHS uniform policy and survey results (Nicole Jenkins). The new draft uniform policy has been created in line with new Department policy and Sunsmart policy. (see attached policy). Discussions between staff, Watter's/ The Warehouse, and survey results (indicating some preference for a warm option, an a more unisex option) have seen some proposed changes to the uniform including

- Replacing the current boys/girls shirt with a red/black sports shirt for daily wear
- Replacing the junior girls dress and senior girls skirt with a black skirt
- Replacing the woollen jumpers with a red V neck windcheater with DHS logo

- Replacing boys shorts with black shorts/pants for all year levels
- Adding a black jacket with DHS logo as an extra warm layer.

Some samples of the above products were available for viewing. Availability of some preferred options has limited choice. Concerns expressed by the committee included :-

- The synthetic sports shirt fabric retains odour. It also gets caught and pulls easily.
- The sports shirt and the V neck windcheater both look very casual and may not portray a professional image of our school.
- The windcheater fabric stains easily and can also pill (it was used as DHS uniform years ago and was replaced by polar fleece which washes and maintains its look for longer).
- The solid red/black of the shirts and black skirts may be too hot for our climate.
